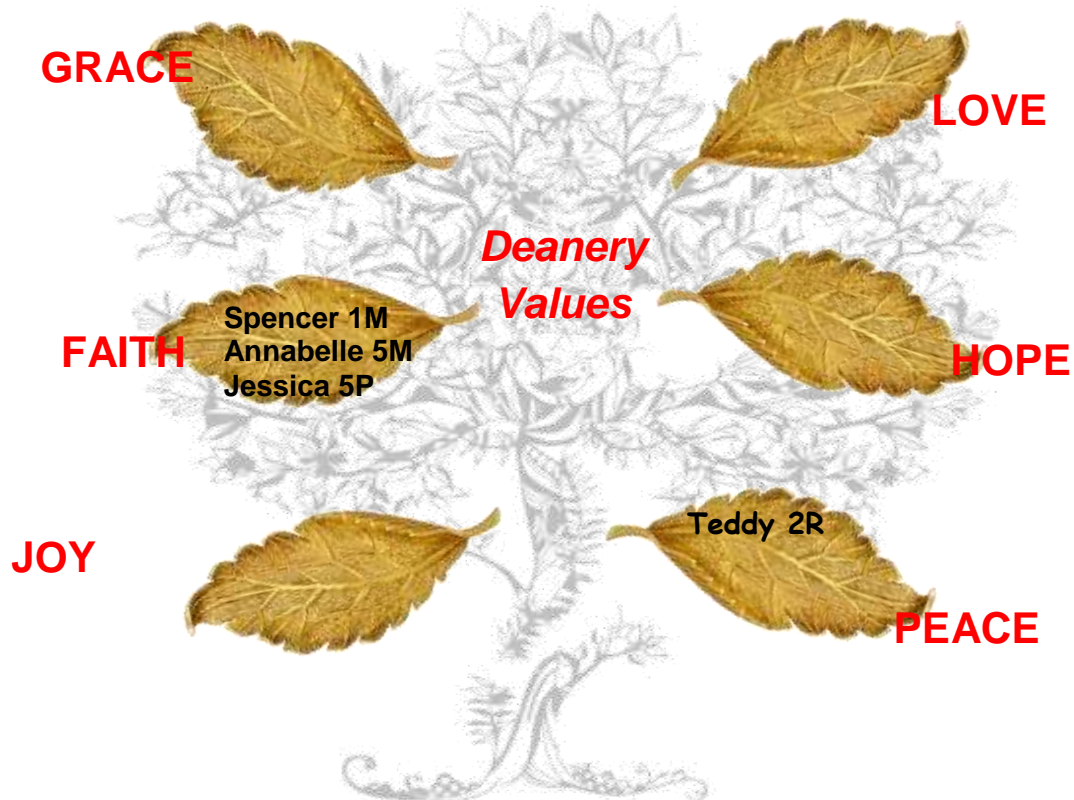

Nursery Open Days

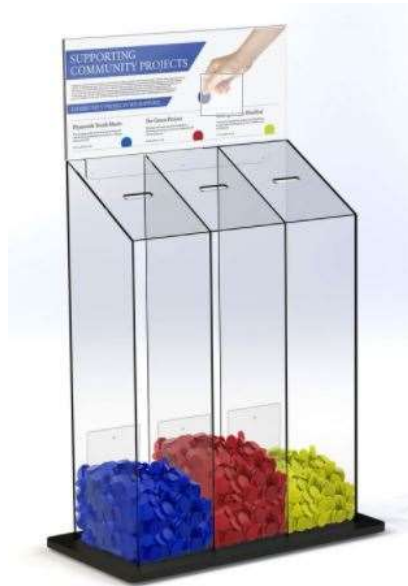
We are holding two nursery open days for prospective parents to look around the Deanery Nursery. Please share these with friends and family who may have a child of nursery age.

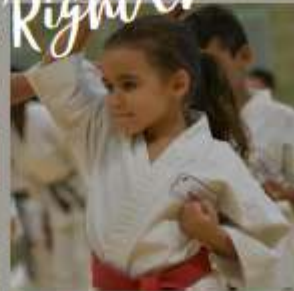

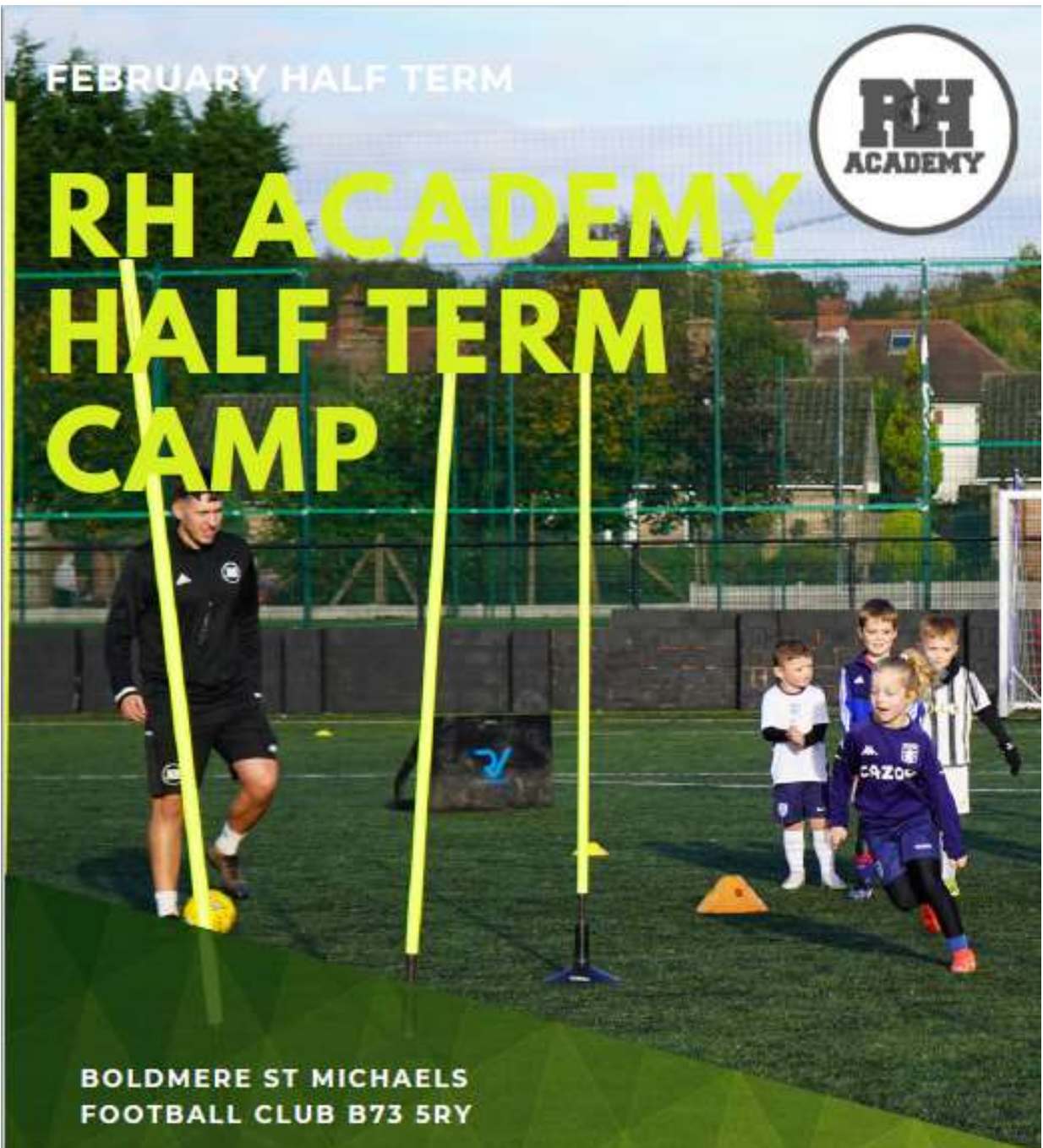
