Well done to all of our year 6 children who undertook the SATS last week. I am so proud of you all.



Abe (30R) - "I have enjoyed all of our RE lessons and learning about symbolism and how trees are a symbol."


Athena J (3T) - "I have enjoyed maths because it is fun! I love learning about money!"

Health & Safety

Although we understand climbing trees can be an enjoyable experience for many young people it must only be carried out with a full risk assessment in place. As we cannot fully supervise and control the area adequately to facilitate tree climbing at the end of the school day, please ensure children do not climb trees on site.

We would hate for a child to be hurt, either by falling from a tree awkwardly/onto hard surfaces etc. or caused from the insufficient strength of the tree that has been undetected or is unsuitable to be climbed in the first place.

Staff are extremely busy during home time, ensuring children safely leave the school with their parent/carer and answering any queries that may be raised, therefore it would stretch resources even further to be able to deal with a child if they were to hurt themselves whilst climbing a tree.

We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate bounce-back to confirm we received your text. Texts will not be seen outside of normal working hours. If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting STOP to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at your usual rate.
