
What an amazing week we have had with so many exciting and interesting visitors and activities to learn about and explore 'creative arts'.


Take a look at the blog to see what children have been up to and do come to the year group assemblies next week.

Phase News

Nursery, Reception and Year 1 have thoroughly enjoyed exploring their creative side by discovering 'connections'. Children have had a different daily creative focus. Reception have been very musical by creating a soundscape to tell the story of 'Goldilocks and the three bears'. Year 1 have create an underwater dance, moving and representing different sea creatures. Nursery have been using the iPads to take photos of their friends, displaying different emotions. We are excited to showcase all our learning in our assemblies next week.

Y2/3 Phase:

There's been such a lovely buzz around Phase this week with Creative Arts week. Year 2 have been exploring false perspective and creating images of themselves telling a story.

Year 3 have explored connections through dance and created their own choreography to the Edward Scissorhands production.

Years 4, 5 & 6:

It has been a fantastic creative arts week and the children across the phase have thoroughly enjoyed exploring film, storytelling, singing and dancing!



Naraya (RHM) - "We have been creative this week my taking pictures of cuddly bears, making shakers for musical instruments and drawing different characters. I have had lots of fun!"

Frankie (2MS) - "I have loved Arts week and liked making up my own dance craze."

Joshua B (3T) - "Swimming - I enjoyed going into the deep end of the pool and doing my 25 metres front crawl."

Hans (4P) - "My favourite thing about creative arts week so far has been looking at movement in Drama. We had to act out different scenarios showing connection between the characters."

Orla (4P) - "We got to create a freeze frame of a family for other people to guess what sort of character we were."

Blacke (4P) - "We made rhythms and beats with different instruments and our bodies to go over a jazz song. The beats had to have syncopated rhythms.

Clara (5H) - "I have loved the creative arts week, specifically making my own song in the singing session."

Austin (5H) - "I found it really fun making movies this week for creative arts and getting to use different camera angles."

Harvey (5MC) - "On Monday we recorded our own iMovie films that were based on The Secret Garden. We learnt how to use body language, facial expressions and camera techniques to create our movies. We also used skills like determination and discipline to create successful movies for others to enjoy."

Emily (5MC) - "Last week we went on a trip with our whole year group to Thinktank in Birmingham. We explored how the heart works and the digestive, which I thought was interesting. We saw robots and we went into the Planetarium which was probably the best bit because we got to learn about the solar system and relax in the comfy chairs! I would definitely recommend it."

Scarlett (6A) - "I loved the Rock, Paper, Scissors story in writing because of the plot and I felt I could really dive in to their world. I have also really enjoyed our Bakery project in maths, designing our own cupcakes and creating their packaging."

Matt B (6W) - "I loved making movies. It was cool to use different angles and skills like panning plus special effects."

If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting STOP to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at your usual rate.






