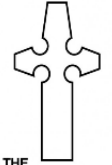
This is the time for transition.

Attendance at Deanery

We have lost 610 learning days due to unauthorised term time holidays this year.

Under the new national framework that comes into force in August, all schools will be required to consider a fine when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons.

Following these guidelines, we would have issued 63 fines this year.

From August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days.

We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate bounce-back to confirm we received your text. Texts will not be seen outside of normal working hours. If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting **STOP** to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at your usual rate.
